Interview Tips for Parents

- 1. Parents should be aware of the school's background, teaching characteristics and school philosophy.
 - 2. Parents should be fully aware of their children's living habits and daily work.
- 3. When your child does not know or slow response, parents should not rush or urge the child, should wait patiently for the child to answer.
- 4. When your child is in a bad mood, parents can ask the teacher to make arrangements to sooth him/her, such as letting him/her play games first.
 - 5. When your child is in a bad mood, don't force him/her to answer, because it will only make his/her mood worse.
- 6. When parents answer questions, just go straight to the point. You should avoid providing extra and unnecessary information.
 - 7. Parents should be polite and avoid showing off.
 - 8. Schools generally attach great importance to the participation and cooperation of parents. If parents show interest in school activities, such as joining a parents-teacher association or volunteer activities, it will leave a good impression on the interviewers.
 - 9. Parents should face the interview calmly. Don't be too nervous, because nervous emotions can be transmitted to children.
