

# 30 Must-Ask Questions



## Self-Introduction

1. What is your name?
2. How old are you?
3. Are you a boy or a girl?

## Family Life

4. Who is here with you today?

## Daily Life

5. How do you come here today?
6. Identify everyday objects, such as cups, toothbrushes and chopsticks. Interviewers may ask your child about their uses and ask him/her to demonstrate.

## English Alphabets

7. Identify the 26 alphabets.

## Numbers

8. Identify the numbers.

## Basic Concepts (shapes, size and colors)

9. What are the colors of the blocks?
10. Identify the genders of toys.

## Common Sense

11. Identify different animals. The interviewers may ask your child about their sounds.
12. Identify fruits.
13. Identify public transport.
14. If there is a transport or an animal, the interviewers may ask about which one can fly, and which one can swim.
15. Show different body parts by pointing at themselves or at a doll.

## Coordinate Activities

16. The interviewers may ask your child to stack some blocks.

## Organizational Ability

17. Finish a simple puzzle.

## Activity Observation

18. Let your child play alone or with the parents, and observe his/her behavior.

## Courtesy

19. Say “Hello” and “Goodbye” to the teachers.
20. When a teacher gives a small gift to your child, he/she should be able to say “Thanks”.

## Questions for Parents

21. Why did you choose our school?
22. What advantages do you think our school has?
23. What do you expect from your children’s future?
24. What are the advantages and disadvantages of your child?
25. Where do you usually go play with your child?
26. Who takes care of the child normally?
27. What difficulties have you encountered when taking care of your child? How did you handle it?
28. Where do you go with your child on holidays?
29. Could your child go to the toilet by himself/herself?
30. What are the habits and preferences of your child at home?
