Kindergarten Interview: 10 Dos & Don'ts



- 1. Know the basic politeness, for example: take the initiative to say "Morning!" "Hello!" to the principal or teacher. When you receive a small gift, your kid should know how to say "thank you", and "goodbye" or "Bye Bye" after the interview.
 - 2. Keep a smile on your face during the interview.
 - 3. Make eye contact with the teacher.
 - 4. Sit or stand straight, maintain a good posture.
 - 5. The clothes are comfortable and suitable, and the appearance is neat and clean.
- 6. Efforts to answer the teacher's questions. It doesn't matter if you can answer correctly, what's more important is to show your willingness to try to answer.
 - 7. Obey the teacher's instructions, such as singing, dancing, and completing simple movements.
 - 8. Parents should also be polite.
 - 9. Parents should be aware of the school's philosophy and background.
- 10. Parents should understand their children's living habits, which represents the parents' daily commitment to the care of children.



- 1. Refuse to sit down, walk around, or even yell.
- 2. Grab other children's toys and even hit people.
- 3. Ignoring or unresponsive to the teacher's questions.
- 4. Look around during the interview and don't focus.
- 5. Many small movements, such as playing fingers, sucking fingers, scratching the head, hands on cheek and so on.
 - 6. Bad sitting posture, such as not sit up straight, swinging one's body and so on.
 - 7. Recited answers.
 - 8. Parents rush to answer for their children.
 - 9. Parents are constantly urging their children to answer questions.
 - 10. Parents scold their children in public.
